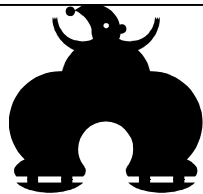

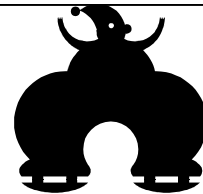

Wrightstown Friends Nursery School invites families interested in the 2012-2013 preschool program to their Open House. Nursery School teachers will be available to answer your questions and to present the School-house facilities located on the grounds of the Wrightstown Friends Meeting, 535 Durham Road (Route 413), Wrightstown, PA. Parents and children are invited to attend.

Wrightstown Friends Nursery School is a small Quaker facility under the care of the Wrightstown Friends Meeting. For more than 30 years, we have helped children develop important social and academic skills through cooperative games, imaginary play and multi-sensory experiences. The curriculum includes numerous field trips, several community service projects, many art activities and an interactive music program provided by nationally known musician and composer, Cathy Block. The school provide hands-on learning in a warm, caring environment. At WFNS, learning is fun!

WFNS offers a five day morning program and a 3-day afternoon program (Tuesday to Thursday). There are approximately 16 children and 3 teachers in each class. There is an additional aide in the afternoon program. The students range in age from 3 to 5 years old. Available openings are limited and vary each year depending on both the number of returning students and siblings who are applying for the first time

THE YEARLY MEETING LIBRARY HAS RE-OPENED!!

The funding for the Yearly Meeting Library was cut from the PYM budget. With these cuts, the library was closed for several months while a new strategy was devised. That strategizing has led to a place where the library can be re-opened two days a week. In the beginning of October the Library Services Group hosted a Volunteer Training. Nine Friends completed that training and most of them are scheduled to volunteer in the library allowing it to be open two days per week. For the immediate future, the library is now open from 12:00 pm to 6:00 pm on Tuesdays and Thursdays. As the skills and number of volunteers increase, hours may be extended into the evenings. With the reopening of the Library, Friends may again check out books, DVD's, Godly Play materials, magazines and pamphlets. The library is not in a position to mail materials to patrons however, so Friends wishing to borrow must either come into the building or arrange for someone else to pick the materials up for them. The library can arrange for materials to be sent back to your meeting with your representative to Interim Meeting on the 2nd Saturday of most months. 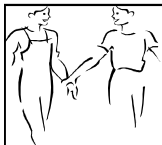
The Peace Center does this through fundraising efforts such as the annual auction and membership drive.
