After some discussion, it was reflected by the Clerk that there remained too many questions to get the minute approved in this meeting. "Fallsington Friends Meeting, in Business Meeting, on November 1, 2015, asks the United States Congress to consider legislation which would impose a steadily rising fee on the carbon content of all fossil fuels, imposed on the producer at the moment the fuel is extracted from the earth or imported from abroad, and that the moneys collected in fees be distributed in equal shares to every household in our country. We urge Friends throughout our Yearly Meeting to examine this approach for transitioning to a low-carbon economy, and to communicate with members of the House and Senate about the importance of reducing carbon emissions in a way that assists lower-income households and others who are most affected by this transition."
