BUCKS QUARTER FRIEND ARRESTED IN ENVIRONMENTAL ACTION TO OPPOSE TAR SAND OIL PIPELINE

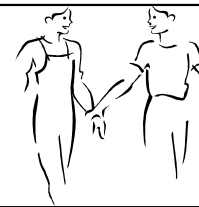
Last week Doylestown MM member, Seth Bush, was one of 1252 environmentalists arrested in front of the White House protesting the Tar Sand "Keystone XL" pipeline currently fast tracked for construction from Alberta, Canada through to Louisiana. This protest is reported to be the greatest act of environmental Civil Disobedience in American history.

Many think stopping the Tar Sand "Keystone XL" pipeline is one of the great environmental issues of this century. This is for several reasons: Tar Sands cause increased green house gases (the project could yield an extra 1.15 billion tons of GHG,) environmental destruction (including old growth forest habitat) in Alberta, Canada, likelihood of leaks in the U.S. - Keystone XL will cross through America's agricultural heartland, the Missouri and Niobrara Rivers, the Ogallala aquifer, and more.

All these detrimental effects and it has been shown that this approach will not reduce dependence on Foreign Oil, will provide few jobs, and actually increase gas costs across the heartland. See <http://www.tarsandsaction.org/> for more info, and take action.
