The morning adult program, will be a panel of speakers from **Pennsylvanians for Alternatives to the Death Penalty**

All three speakers are PADP Board Members

David Rose has worked in the field of Corrections for over thirty years and is one of the co-founders of the local Lehigh Valley Committee Against State Killing. He will outline some of the failures of the system which can be used to argue for a moratorium on executions.

Karl Keys is an attorney who has assisted in numerous appeals from inmates on Death Row and is the founder of a internet site that focuses on legal developments surrounding the issue of the death penalty. He is also on the board of New Jerseyans Against the Death Penalty and will share some of the lessons learned in organizing in another state around the issue of the death penalty.

Andy Hoover is the Co-Chair of PADP and is employed by the Pennsylvania ACLU as a community organizer. He will describe some of the effort currently underway in Pennsylvania to organize other organizations, including Religious Communities, around the issue and influence legislation.

If persons who attend are interested in organizing a presentation which would include an exonerated inmate or a member of a victims family which opposes the death penalty, information will be available which will tell them how to do it.

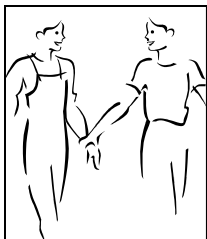

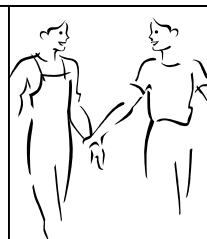
