**Walk the Road of Peace** For 50 years, during the Christmas season, people who believe in the importance of peace have been gathering to walk from Nazareth to Bethlehem (only ten miles in this country)!

This pilgrimage, symbolic of the journey of Mary and Joseph, it provides those who walk, those who pass by on the highway and even those who just read about the walk in the Sunday paper, with an opportunity to think about what Christmas really means. Walk with your family and friends, and make new friends. If you are concerned about your ability to complete the walk, please know that there are frequent rest stops and relief transportation.

**More than a Walk** Even if you cannot walk a portion of the pilgrimage, please consider participating in our related events. There will be traditional hymn singing in the heart of historic Bethlehem. 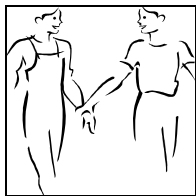

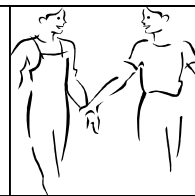
### OXFAM HUNGER BANQUET AT BUCKINGHAM FRIENDS SCHOOL
