'A PEOPLE TO PEOPLE CONNECTION'

In April, Holly Olson asked Elaine and Charlie Fettig of Buckingham Meeting to host David Bucura who was visiting the U.S. from Rwanda. David is a Clerk of Friends World Committee for Consultation-Africa Section and Central Africa Coordinator for the African Great Lakes Region as well as AVP facilitator and mediation facilitator. The Fettigs were happy to host David and during the visit they learned that he is also very much involved in creating five Peace Libraries for kids in Rwanda. The official language in Rwanda recently changed from French to English so getting books in English is important, but expensive.

Elaine thought of a way to help David's book collection. She knew that a woman, Christy Sommers, from "Where There Be Dragons" was leading a trip to Rwanda in June with a group of American high school students. Elaine had Christy ask the teenagers to each bring a book for the library with them. She also gave David and Christy each other's email address so they could meet.

It turned out very well! The American teenagers not only donated books, but they also were able to meet with David and learn about Quaker peace work in Africa. Here is what Christy wrote to Elaine after the trip:

"Dear Elaine,

My whole group was able to meet with David, and we had an incredibly interesting visit to the Quaker school where he works. We brought all the books that had been collected to donate to their library, and then ended up spending half a day with them visiting the school, talking to students and administrators, and seeing their library, computer lab, and other facilities. It looks like a great school and they were wonderful hosts.

And, later, after Elaine told Christy about putting this in our newsletter:

How great that you would like to share our visit to the Quaker school with your group! Honestly, I appreciate you putting us in touch with them, as it was a great opportunity to learn from them. My students really got a lot out of the visit. The headmaster made time to speak with a group of the students and was very patient answering their many many questions. We've already talked about going to visit them again next summer!
