In 2008, he helped found an intentional community and urban farm in Northwest Philadelphia which he continues to lead.

QUARTERLY MEETING MINUTES
August 24, 2014
Held at Plumstead Monthly Meeting**

Clerk made announcements and described the format for being recognized.

Roll Call of Meetings: Bristol:1, Buckingham:1, Doylestown:2, Fallsington: 4, Lehigh Valley: 2, Makefield: 3, Middletown:3, Newtown:5, Plumstead: 3, Quakertown NJ: 2, Solebury: 4, Southampton: 1, Wrightstown: 1, Yardley: 5.

Friends applauded the 100% meeting participation.

Minutes read and approved.

United Friends School Annual Report presented by Nancy Donnelly, (Head of School, member Unami MM). As part of the Membership Renewal Process (MRP) by the Friends Council on Education the school has been asking itself the question posed by Christie Duncan-Tessmer during this morning's program, "How does the Truth fair with Thee?"

Wrightstown MM Annual Report given by Leo Fitzpatrick, Clerk. Membership remains the same. Meeting has just had a called meeting regarding the paving of the parking lot. This is a large and expensive undertaking and the process to get it passed by the Meeting has gone very well.

Treasurer report given by Ed Snyder (Yardley MM). Introduced as the quarter's new Treasurer by Betsy Bayardi (Wrightstown MM) who thanked the Nominations Committee for the work they did. Reviewed past year and pointed out that we had revenue less expenses of \$2,577.16.

Yardley MM Annual Report given by Betsy Cadwallader with special Yardley Religious Education report given by Jenna Seuffert (Middle School Friends RE Coordinator, Member Middletown MM). Membership numbers are stable. The report highlighted success of the Annual Flea Market. Meeting is active with Outreach and involved with Bucks Food For Friends. Men's Group being formed to meet monthly. Peace and Social Action Committee has been active again. Jenna Seuffert spoke of the trip to Washington DC by the Middle School FDS class.

Plumstead Meeting Minutes on Gaza and Iraq were presented by Beth Taylor, Clerk. Minutes on Iraq and Gaza were passed by Plumstead on August 8th. After discussion, the clerk summarized his sense that the Quarter is in sympathy with the minutes but cannot find unity at this time to pass the minute as presented nor find a way to resolve the issue.

QM encourages other Meetings to consider the issues on their own.

Solebury Meeting Annual Report given by John Kellogg, Clerk. Membership is stable. Oversight and Counsel has been attempting to establish contact with Young Adult Friends. Worship and Ministry is providing discussions focused on reading of poems.

Outreach provided update on Grange Fair, Peace Fair, and request for Bucks Quarter logo suggestions. Holly attended the "Gathering on Revitalizing our Quarterly Meetings" and provided a summary of the experience.

Southampton Meeting Annual Report provided by Carolyn A. Peters-Eckel, Clerk. Meeting for worship on First Day is only held on Fourth Sunday of month. Discussion group is held on Tuesday evening. Meetinghouse is also being used by other groups and congregations.
