### 49TH ANNUAL NAZARETH TO BETHLEHEM PEACE PILGRIMAGE

Walk the Road of Peace **Saturday, December 13, 2008**. For almost 50 years, during the Christmas season, people who believe in the importance of peace have been gathering to walk from Nazareth to Bethlehem (only ten miles in this country)!

This pilgrimage, symbolic of the journey of Mary and Joseph, provides all of us, those who walk, those who pass us on the highway and even those who just read about the walk in the Sunday paper, with an opportunity to think about what Christmas really means. Come, walk with your family and friends, and make new friends who seek a more peaceful world. If you are concerned about your ability to complete the walk, please know that there are frequent rest stops and relief transportation.

It's more than a walk. Even if you cannot walk a portion of the pilgrimage, please consider participating in our related events. There will be traditional hymn singing in the heart of historic Bethlehem. Following singing, we'll walk a little farther to the Christ United Church of Christ for a simple supper. After supper, guest speaker, Janet Chisholm, Peace, Justice and Training Coordinator at Kirkridge Retreat and Study Center and a lifetime worker for Peace. Her presentation is entitled "Walking Away from Fear."

### HEEDING GOD'S CALL A GATHERING ON PEACE

Planning for "Heeding God's Call" -- the peace gathering in Philadelphia that has become a joint effort of Philadelphia Yearly Meeting, the Church of the Brethren and the Mennonite Church USA -- has been proceeding in exciting directions.

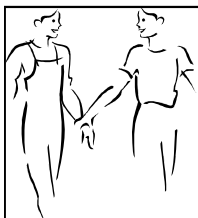
Noted author and activist Dr. Vincent Harding will be with the Gathering along with Elaine Kirkland, M.Div, United Church of Christ. It is planned that they will address delegates each day of the Gathering.

Two community organizers, Ched Myers and Alexie Torres Fleming, will speak to the work of the Spirit in their lives as they have been led to the work of peace building in their communities and beyond. Thirty workshops will explore six different scriptural calls.

Worship will occur throughout the Gathering. Morning worships will be led by Colin Saxton of Northwest Yearly Meeting; Rabbis Phyllis Berman and Arthur Waskow of the Shalom Center; and Bishop Gayle Harris of the Episcopal Church Massachusetts diocese.

On Saturday, January 17, the Gathering will expand to include people of faith from around the Delaware Valley. Our expectation is that approximately 2,000 people will participate. Morning programs will take place at multiple faith communities. After a simple lunch, all will gather at the church called Holy Ghost Headquarters ("the Met") at 858 North Broad Street for a concluding plenary session, cumulating with a public witness.

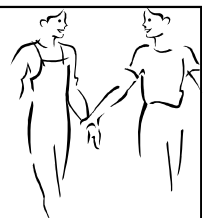
