



ATTENTION QUAKER PARENTS!!

Are you comfortable enough in your Quaker skin to raise Quaker children with joy and confidence? Would you like support in this area? Then plan to attend the Quaker Parenting workshop brought to Bucks Quarter by the Quaker Parenting Initiative (QPI) and led by Harriet Heath.

Quakerism has much to offer parents as parents search to nurture their children towards responsible adulthood.

* Our Quaker faith has beliefs that can support parents' efforts. The belief for instance that a Way will open supports parents as they see their child experimenting in unhealthy behaviors. The belief in continuing revelation keeps parents trying to stay open to understanding this child they love so well.

* The Testimonies set guides for our parenting. How to live simply in a society based on materialism? Does the Peace Testimony hold any meaning to how we interact with each other within the family?

* And Quaker practices offer parents so much. Just using queries rather than "shoulds" encourages parents to think through what they want for their children.

These are some of the Quaker strengths we will explore with parents in our discussion sessions as parents pursue their own individual issues. Parents attending the series learn about Quakerism and/or become more aware of the meaning of our faith for our everyday lives.

The web site, www.quakerparenting.org has other information about what the Quaker Parenting Initiative has to offer parents.

The six sessions are scheduled to begin on **January 23rd and will run from 1-3pm** (bring a brown bag lunch) location to be determined. The total cost for the workshop is \$600 divided by the number of attendees. There will be childcare available and those providing childcare will be paid \$10 per hour (please let Holly Olson know if your teen is led to provide child care).

51st ANNUAL NAZARETH TO BETHLEHEM PEACE PILGRIMAGE SATURDAY , DECEMBER 11


Walk the Road of Peace For 51 years, people have been gathering to walk from Nazareth to Bethlehem This pilgrimage, symbolic of the journey of Mary and Joseph, provides those who walk, those who pass by on the highway and those who just read about it in the Sunday paper, with an opportunity to think about what Christmas really means. If you are concerned about your ability to complete the walk, there are frequent rest stops and relief transportation.

More than a Walk If you cannot walk a portion of the pilgrimage, consider participating in the related events; Traditional hymn singing Christmas Carols at the Central Moravian Church steps, simple supper and guest speaker at the Christ United Church of Christ at Market & Center Streets. This years speaker will be, Nancy Tate, Coordinator of LEPOCO, one of the oldest continuously active peace groups in the Northeast and the Nation. Nancy's presentation will be titled, ***WE HAVE ONLY BEGUN: REFLECTIONS ON OUR WORK FOR PEACE!***

- B. 12:00P** Pilgrimage begins at Moravian Church, Nazareth.
- C. 1:30** Rest stop, Trinity Lutheran Church, on Rt. #191 just north of Steuben Rd.
- D. 2:45** Rest stop, First Baptist Church, on Rt. #191 between Oakland Rd. and Johnson Drive.
- E. 3:45** Light candles, First Church of the Nazarene, 1500 Linden St., Bethlehem.
- F. 4:45** Singing Christmas Carols at the Central Moravian Church steps.
- G. 5:30** Supper, Christ United Church of Christ, Market & Center Streets.


