WRONG THING: Racial Justice and Authentic Community Using the Strategies of the H.E.A.R.T.

Bucks Quarterly Meeting is pleased to sponsor this very important workshop lead by Dr. Amanda Kemp. We will gather on Saturday Jan 14, from 10AM to 3:30PM. The goals for the day are many; to provide a space for Friends to process the feelings, ideas and openings that have emerged since the PYM Summer Sessions, to build up capacity to stay curious and open and grounded during conversations that promote authentic connection and disagreement, to introduce the 5 strategies as spiritual principles that we get better at with conscious practice, to identify strategies and concrete next steps that each person will take to promote racial justice and authentic community in some area of their lives. ***This could include the Pendle Hill Weekend workshop on the Five Strategies on Feb. 24-26, 2017*** and to deepen the connection between Friends in a space that STRETCHES and SUPPORTS us.

Say the Wrong Thing

In our increasingly polarized and violent national context, this workshop is a sacred space to practice leaning into self-compassion and stretching beyond our comfort zone. Recognizing that we are all in this together, Amanda offers five spiritual practices that emerged in the course of her work as an artist, mother, educator and racial justice advocate.

The Five Strategies of the H.E.A.R.T. are:

- Hold space for transformation
- Express yourself
- Act with Intention
- Reflect on yourself
- Trust the Process

57th ANNUAL NAZARETH TO BETHLEHEM PEACE PILGRIMAGE

SATURDAY, DECEMBER 10th

Walk the Road of Peace

This pilgrimage, symbolic of the journey of Mary and Joseph, provides those who walk, those who pass by on the highway and those who just read about it in the Sunday paper, with an opportunity to think about what Christmas really means. If you are concerned about your ability to complete the walk, there are frequent rest stops and relief transportation.

More than a Walk If you cannot walk a portion of the pilgrimage, consider participating in the related events; Traditional hymn singing Christmas Carols at the Central Moravian Church steps, simple supper and guest speaker at the Christ United Church of Christ at Market & Center Streets.

This year's speaker will be, Maryann Cusimano Love who is an Assoc. Prof. of Politics at Catholic Univ. and an expert on international security and peacebuilding. **Her presentation is entitled: Building a Better Peace.**

Among many things, Maryann is on the Advisory Board of the Catholic Peacebuilding Network, serves on the Core Group for the Dept. of State's working group on Religion and Foreign Policy, member of the Intl. Policy Committee of the US Catholic Conf. of Bishops, was a fellow at the Commission on International Religious Freedom, taught at the Pentagon, consulted for the National Intelligence Council and UN working group on Human Trafficking. **10:45** Buses begin leaving 520 E. Broad Street (Bechtel Building, Bethlehem for Nazareth.). **Noon:** Pilgrimage begins at Moravian Church, Nazareth. **1:30** Rest stop, Trinity Lutheran Church, on Rt. #191 just north of Steuben Rd. **2:45** Rest stop, First Baptist Church, on Rt. #191 between Oakland Rd. and Johnson Drive. **3:45** Light candles, First Church of the Nazarene, 1500 Linden St, Bethlehem **4:45** Singing Christmas Carols at the Central Moravian Church steps. **5:30** Supper and rally, Christ United Church of Christ, Market & Center Streets. Register at www.Peacewalk.org/Registration and include the names of all people coming with you. You are welcome to come even if you have not preregistered. You may join at any point along the way, times listed above are approximate. Dress appropriately for the weather; the walk takes place in sun, wind, rain or snow.
