### Agenda for Business Session:

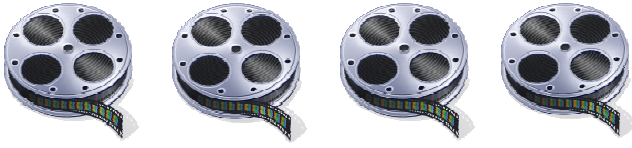
In their Annual Reports, Doylestown, Makefield and Quakertown Meetings will share with us the life of their Meetings, their good works and programs.

### MOVIE NIGHT AT NEWTOWN MEETING

Michael Franti's documentary "I Know I'm Not Alone," will be shown at Newtown Meeting on **February 2, at 7 PM.** Michael Franti, world-renowned musician and human rights worker, traveled to Iraq, Palestine and Israel to explore the human cost of war with a group of friends, some video cameras and his guitar. A true arm chair travel film pulling the audience into these war zones in the company of Michael's guitar, eloquence and wit—you feel the humanity, artistic resilience and sometimes horrific experience of what it's like to live under the bombs and military occupation. Franti states "This film came out of my frustration with watching the nightly news and hearing generals, politicians and pundits, explaining the political and economic cost of the war in the Middle East, without ever mentioning the human cost. I wanted to hear about the war by the people affected by it most: doctors, nurses, poets, artists, soldiers and personal favorite, musicians." Global Exchange founder Medea Benjamin calls the film an "antidote to despair." "Franti sings his way through two brutal occupations—Iraq and Palestine, breaking through the hate and revealing the oneness of our human family." "I Know I'm Not Alone", ([www.iknowimnotalone.com](http://www.iknowimnotalone.com)), is the winner of San Francisco International Film Festival's Best Documentary and Harlem International Film Festival's Best International Documentary.

“A thank you to the families of the victims at the Amish School in Nickel Mines, Lancaster County and their faith Community,

On October 2, 2006 the lives of the families of the students who were victimized by a lone disturbed man were forever altered. The actions of the Amish community during this horror have become a light to teach the rest of us. Rather than surrendering to what would be interpreted as justifiable anger, the Amish community chose to embrace their faith and open their hearts in the spirit of forgiveness and healing.

At a time when any event may be used to support the point of view of those responding, you the members of the Amish Community were able to embrace your faith and look to the future. You opened your heart with forgiveness to the family of Charles Roberts as well as Charles Roberts himself. You used the foundations of your faith to hold you firm in the eyes of each other and the world. Your actions remind each of us of the power of forgiveness and the strength that comes from a grounded relationship with our Creator.

When the Nations of the world use events (9/11 for one) to justify war, destruction, torture, and other acts of inhumanity you have taken your circumstance and used it to show humanity and reflect your faith. Your Faith Community has realized that the gunman's family was a victim of the horror of that day and wrapped your healing arms around them. You have also shown that the true mission is to look to the future. As Quakers (Religious Society of Friends) we have been awakened by your courage to live our faith and to act with the values our community says we embrace.

It is with humility and admiration that we look to your example as a guiding light for our own acts.”

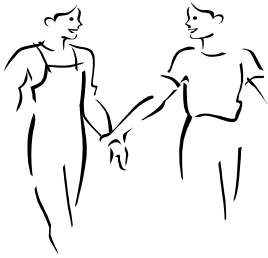

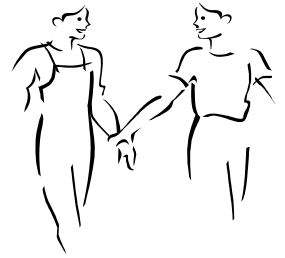
