MEETING FOR BUSINESS**

First Day, 15 Second Month 2009

HELD AT BUCKINGHAM MONTHLY MEETING

Clerk: Chris Lucca (Yardley MM)

Recording Clerk: David Rose (Lehigh Valley MM)

Friends gathered at 1:00 p.m. and settled into worship. **Business Issues:** Agenda reviewed and approved.

Roll Call: Bristol: 2, Buckingham: 4, Doylestown: 2, Fallsington: 1, Lehigh Valley: 2, Makefield: 4, Middletown: 4, Newtown: 2, Plumstead: 2, Quakertown: 1, Solebury: 1, Southampton: 3, Wrightstown: 1, Yardley: 1. It was recognized with expressions of joy that this is the first time in the memory of many present that all Meetings within the Quarter were represented at a Quarterly Meeting.

Minutes of Eighth Month Quarterly Meeting **approved.**

United Friends School Report given by Nancy Donnelly, Head of School and member of Unami MM. Nancy spoke of the background of the school and its relationship to the Quarter. 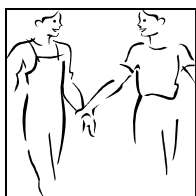

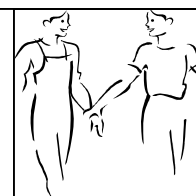
