Held at Solebury Monthly Meeting, November 16, 2014

Minutes of August 24, 2014 were read and approved with one correction.

Stories of Vitality were shared

Coordinator's Report given by Holly Olson (Middletown MM). In-reach portion reported on the Clerk's meeting, Religious Education meeting cancelation, Spiritual Formation program cancelation, Facebook page (please "like"), work on Bristol Meeting records, help and support provided to a Young Friend, and upcoming New Year's Eve skating party. Outreach report noted the success of the Peace Fair, participation in Historic Fallsington Day and Historic Bristol Day. Holly has been meeting with other Quarter Coordinators and will be visiting other Quarterly Meetings. Friends were encouraged to attend one of the General Secretary Tours sessions around PYM.

Treasurer's Report given by Ed Snyder (Yardley MM). Activity for the first fiscal quarter is as expected. No items of concern reported. He reported that since the end of the report in September, an additional \$20,000 has been sent to PYM.

Newtown MM Annual Report given by Rich Richardson for Wendy Kane. Membership at end of 2013 stood at 295 with 15 new members joining since then. Work done by the Library committee, the First Day School classes, annual fundraisers under care of the Children's Religious Education committee, Peace and Service concerns were reported on. Also noted were concerns about meeting financial obligations and the upcoming 200th anniversary of the Meeting.

Bucks Quarter Peace Fair report given by Tim Cunningham (Buckingham). This year was notable for the strong sense of community that was expressed by the help provided by other meetings. Next year's Peace Fair will be September 19, 2015. Planning will start earlier and reach out for help sooner. Looking for meetings to adopt a specific responsibility. Karen Gallager (Norristown MM) spoke about the Young Friends involvement with the fair and how important it is for them. Request made to have Meetings sign up for a task as early as possible.

Auditor's Report read by Betsy Bayardi (Wrightstown MM) for Alan Gray (Plumstead MM). Report found BQM financial records to be in good order.

Nomination request present.

- David Smith (Solebury MM) was nominated to PYM Nomination Committee: **Approved.**
- Betsy Bayardi (Wrightstown MM) nominated to be "At Large" member to PYM Nomination Committee: **Approved.**

Plumstead MM Annual Report read by Lane Taylor for Beth Taylor. The Meeting continues to be a "small, simple and quiet Meeting" with First Day School averaging five to seven children. Community building activities are ongoing and members are involved in a number of both local groups and the larger Quaker Community.

Camp Onas Annual Report given by Lane Taylor (Plumstead MM and Board Member). Lane noted that the camp will be undertaking a large capital campaign to upgrade the pool. Friends were encouraged to attend worship at the camp during the summer. Meetings in the Quarter who do not have their allotted two board appointments filled were encouraged to do so.

Announcements:

- Kelly Schussell-Edens, clerk of the quarter's Outreach Committee will be moving away from the area in a little over a year and urges the Quarter to find a replacement that she can train in the meantime.
- Tyler Hoff from Friends Home and Village CEO (Yardley MM) introduced himself. He also noted that FHV is also looking for additional Board members.
- Tribe One, a group that Jonathan Snipes has been part of for the past twenty years, will be performing their anniversary concert in Germantown in December,
- Extended worship opportunities are being provided by the PYM Meeting for Worship and Ministry (MFW)
