2) Rwanda Workcamp – Gisenyi

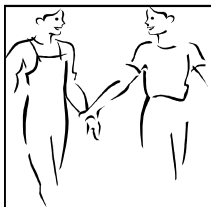

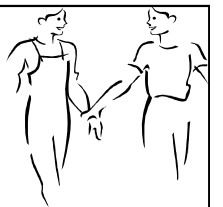
