FORMING AN INTERFAITH COALITION IN (CENTRAL BUCKS)

TO ADOPT A SYRIAN REFUGEE FAMILY

Late last autumn during Friend's worship, Norma Kaplis (Newtown, Makefield MMs and Tzedek v'Shalom) had a leading regarding Tikkun Olam, "healing the world." She has been deeply affected by the violence in Syria, the mass migrations to Europe, and the sometimes harsh response to these migrants, here and abroad. Her leading went straight to her Heart. "If you find a home in your community for one refugee family, you are helping to heal the world." And so it was clear to Norma what to do...to put together an Interfaith Coalition in the Bucks area to bring a family to live in this community, and where members of this coalition would work together to help this family become independent, as well as to feel loved and respected. Tzedek v'Shalom has supported Norma's leading, with two members on a Committee to get the project started. The group is currently in an information gathering period and recruiting folks from other faith communities in the Newtown, Yardley, Doylestown area to participate. This article is a call for help in the service project. So far three members of Doylestown Friends Meeting have expressed interest in helping, as well as one person from Kol Emet synagogue. The Bucks County Buddhist Sanga has been approached. **There will be a meeting on March 23rd from 7 to 8 PM at the Newtown Friends meetinghouse** for all persons interested, to start doing specific tasks to help accomplish the adoption.
