This January, in the Sacred Valley of Peru, Friends from 37 countries and 77 yearly meetings experienced the FWCC World Plenary Meeting, connecting with Quakers from diverse backgrounds including a great variety of unprogrammed and programmed worship. Four Friends from Fallsington Meeting journeyed to Peru for this international conference for consultation and have stories, a video, and songs to share.

9:45 - Noon: Children's Program - The children's program, "Amigas y Amigos" will talk of the many branches of the Quaker Tree: differing cultures, meetinghouses and worship. Children will help prepare Lamington Cake in honor of Australian Friends. We will learn the song Amigas y Amigos and teach it to everyone at the rise of Meeting for worship.

11:00 - Noon: Meeting for Worship: Worship will include the "Experiment With Light" Fallsington Friends experienced in Peru, shared by European Friends. Experiment With Light is a series of queries, drawn from the writings of George Fox and the experience of Early Friends. Simple statements are read during the beginning of worship, and help to focus and deepen our experience. Friends should expect approximately one half hour of worship during which the queries are read at intervals, and then another half hour of unprogrammed worship. Across the centuries, Quakers have used queries as a discipline of spiritual challenge, to encourage us to move closer to God, and to be faithful in our testimonies. The experience of the Experiment with the Light in Peru was deeply meaningful, and Friends offer it to you with Love.

Noon: Lunch will include some international dishes.

1:00-3:00: Business Session - We will hear from our Friends at Buckingham, Fallsington, Lehigh and Bristol Meetings as well as our Coordinator, BQ Oversight Committee, Chandler Hall, The Quaker School at Horsham. Our Treasurer will present the final draft of 2016-17 budget.

Minutes of Quarterly Meeting - February 21, 2016 - Held at Buckingham Meeting

Clerk: Boris Simkovich (Makefield) **Recording Clerk:** David Rose (LehighValley)

Agenda reviewed and approved.

First Day School project: The children's program was done in conjunction with the morning's program on "Friendly Water for the World".

Roll Call of Meetings: Bristol: 0, Buckingham: 8, Doylestown: 1, Fallsington: 2, Lehigh Valley:3, Makefield: 2, Middletown: 4, Newtown: 5, Plumstead: 0, Quakertown NJ: 3, Solebury: 2, Southampton: 3, Wrightstown: 1, Yardley: 4

Previous Minutes of November 15, 2015 approved with edits.

Stories of Vitality and Strength shared.

- Lehigh Valley a visitor who said that she came because of our web site
- Four members from Fallsington attended a Friends World Committee for Consultation.

Report of the Coordinator given by Holly Olson(Middletown MM). She reported on Christmas events, a Memorial Service, upcoming Caregiver Training, Movie Night at Middletown, Clerks Meeting, and Quaker 800's dinner. The Ice Skating Party is not drawing enough Friends to justify rental of an entire rink. Also "Quakerism in a Nutshell" and planning for the Peace Fair. Also her deep involvement organizing help for a family from Florida who became stranded in Bucks County due to a medical emergency.

Friends Home and Village Annual Report given CEO Tyler Hoff (Yardley MM). He noted some of the changes that have occurred since he arrived less than two years ago, most significantly increasing the occupancy rate from 70-80% to over current rate of 95%. There will be a capital campaign for a needed elevator and fire tower. He noted that there has already been \$175,000 set aside for this project and that the campaign will kick off in April or May.

Fallsington Meeting Minute on Climate Change as held over from last Quarterly Meeting was read by Clerk. In response to the question regarding administrative costs, answers can be found on the Citizen's Climate Lobby website (www.citizensclimatelobby.org) and that there has already been a process created by the IRS to handle such distributions. The first step is to get the concept of a carbon fee to be considered. Yardley Meeting has considered the carbon fee and dividend proposal and is supportive. After some further discussion the Fallsington minute was approved and adopted by Bucks Quarterly Meeting:
The minute will be forwarded to PYM.

Quakertown Monthly Meeting Annual Report given Gerry Kerwin. Gerry described Quakertown as small but active monthly meeting that would appreciate Newtown MM sending some of their over three hundred members to Quakertown.

Treasurer's Report given by Assistant Treasurer Ed Snyder. Some issues that could be causes for concern in meeting our budget this year is that expected contributions from one meeting have been reduced by about \$4,000

Proposed Budget for 2016-2017 given by Ed Snyder (Yardley MM). PYM has asked for an increase 1.5% that is noted in the budget. He covered some of the assumptions that the balanced preliminary budget is based on including some increase by Monthly Meeting and a "plug" amount listed as Additional contributions.

Nomination Report: Ed Snyder reported for the Budget and Nominating Committee. They are putting Rick Dow forward (Lehigh Valley) as Rising Clerk. Nomination approved.

Doylestown Annual Report given by Wendy Steginsky. There has been a steady growth of attenders and children with eight attenders becoming members in 2015. Activities reported on included donations of food from FDS garden, letter writing, Hiroshima Day rally, contacting Friends at a distance, capital improvements, and used of meetinghouse by other groups.

Outreach Committee Annual Report given by Outgoing Committee Clerk Kellie L. Schlusser-Edens (Yardley Meeting). The summary for 2015 included the Quaker Tent at the Middletown Grange Fair with the suggestion that this event be laid down, Facebook page, assistance to Monthly Meetings, need for Monthly Meeting appointments to Outreach, the Bucks Quarter Outreach Idea Manual, and official notice that she will be moving to Oregon this year and will need to be released from this committee position. At the conclusion of her report, the meeting considered the suggestion contained in the report to lay down Bucks Quarter's presence at the Middletown Grange Fair. Question raised about forming a committee specifically to work on the Grange Fair. After discussion, it was decided that there was not enough energy evident to continue and that the recommendation to lay down the BQM presence at the Grange Fair is approved. Minute of Appreciation passed by the Outreach Committee for the work that Kellie has done was read by Holly Olson.

Makefield Monthly Meeting Annual Report given by Clerk Boris Simkovich. He described the strength of the community and the depth of the worship as the basis for what he believes to be a change that will be noted when Friends look back at the history of what will be a vibrant and growing community.

Meeting concluded at 3:20 p.m.
