#### PHOTOGRAPHY EXHIBIT MIDDLETOWN FRIENDS MEETING

Please join Middletown Friends Meeting in Langhorne, as it celebrates "Quakers in Cuba," a photography exhibition featuring the work of member and professional photographer David DiMicco. Last summer, David accompanied a group of Quaker educators to Cuba. The George School group helped rebuild a church that had been damaged by a series of storms. David documented the group's efforts in this service project. Most people are surprised when they hear there is religion in Cuba, and even more so that there are Quakers. Quaker missionaries brought their faith to Cuba in the latter part of the 19th century. David's images are portraits of Quakers, with a mix of family portraits in homes and individual portraits shot at Eglacia Evangelica dos los Amegos, the Quaker church in Holguin. David is a co-owner, with stylist Meagan Longcore, of DiMicco Longcore Photoworks in New York. DLP creates still digital images for print, television and online use. Their studio is located in the Chelsea gallery district.


