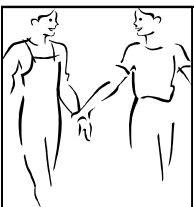

PEACE CAMP 2011

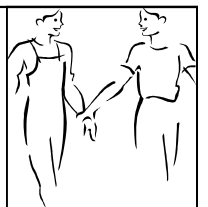
