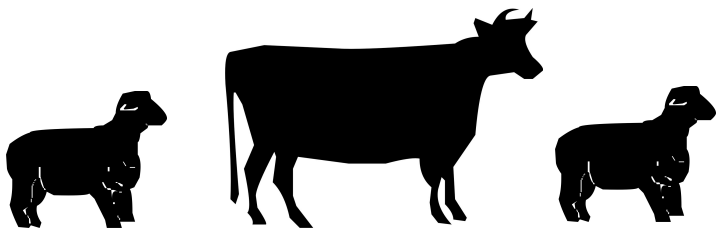

May 19, 2013

Friends gathered around the appointed hour of 1:00 PM and settled into a period of worship

Clerks Comments: Amy Ward Brimmer was feeling ill and not able to attend.

Agenda reviewed, modified and accepted.

Roll Call of Meetings: Bristol:2, Buckingham:4, Doylestown:2, Fallsington: 0, LehighValley: 5, Makefield: 3, Middletown:2, Newtown: 4, Plumstead: 0, Quakertown NJ: 2, Solebury: 1, Southampton: 1, Wrightstown: 0, Yardley: 2.

Minutes read and approved with corrections noted

Vitality and Growth : Stories of Vitality and Growth were shared.

Coordinator's Report given by Holly Olson. "Inreach" portion reported on Clerks Meeting, Aging Workshop at Yardley, Fund Raisers at Lehigh Valley MM, Prayer Course, Meeting Photos, and New Hope Pride Parade. "Outreach" portion covered the "North Star" movie, Quakerism in a Nutshell, Grange Fair Quaker Tent, Parenting Initiative, and Final Third of Life for 2013. Holly also reported on her involvement in helping David Bucura, the Clerk of FWCC Africa Section, present around the area over a period of time about the work being done in Africa. She also shared her experience with the PYM Long Range Planning Visioning Session on April 13th. Holly closed her report by showing an example of the new BQ advertising campaign that was designed by a 12 year old Friend from Plumstead Meeting.

Annual Report for Buckingham Meeting given by Tim Cunningham. This has been a year of Growth with new applications for membership. The meeting has started an inter-generational Games Night, Quaker Conversations after meeting, and a Social Justice Movie Night. The Peace Fair will be on Sept 21. Capital upkeep is a constant issue with the good news being that some grants have been received. Personal contact has been made with British meeting closest to Buckingham in England.

Annual Report for Fallsington Meeting given by Rick Dow from Lehigh Valley. The Meetinghouse currently houses, in the basement, the "Levittown Museum of Modern Suburbia" until its move to Bolton Manor. Members of the meeting are involved in a variety of interfaith efforts including Bucks Food For Friends.

Proposed Minute of Appreciation for Carole Wicker and Karen Shaudys read by Bethann Morgan (Buckingham MM) and approved. Friends Wicker and Shaudys have served our quarter and yearly meeting with love and faith for decades.

Annual Report for Chandler Hall read by Holly Olson. Complete report available.

Annual Report for United Friends School given by Louis Herbst of Richland MM. He spoke of the numerous ways that the lessons of the testimony on Integrity are taught to all the children in the school. The school has a large diverse population. He closed the presentation with the request that if you have a Quaker school nearby, that you should become involved because most Quaker schools are seeking the involvement of Friends.

Treasurer's Report given by Tim Dyer (Bristol MM). There were no issues of concern with our current financial situation regarding revenue. Expense over budget line item for Operating expense was caused by the purchase of a computer for the coordinator.

Budget and Nominating: Proposed Budget presented by Janet Braker (Newtown). The budget was balanced with a line item for "Additional Contributions". Budget approved as presented with a balance budget of \$263,210.00

Annual Report for Lehigh Valley Meeting given by Rick Dow. Clerk LVMM. Complete report is available. Social Action is strong with a major concern for education on Fracking. Young Friends are raising money for public transportation to shelters for those homeless. Both Adult education and First Day school are vibrant with an expansion of First Day classes to pre-kindergarten.

Annual Report for Bristol Meeting given by Bob Atkinson for Paul Shaffer. This meeting is evolving and growing. New members have enabled the meeting to organize three new committees. The meeting house is also used by a Hispanic congregation which has led to some joint celebrations.

Annual Report Oversight Committee read by David Rose (Clerk of Comm). Report focused on the work of inter-visitation done by the Coordinator and members of the committee.

Clerk of the Quarter Annual Report read by Doug Meaker on behalf of Amy Ward Brimmer. It listed a number of examples of the work
