MEDIATION AND NEGOTIATION TRAINING
 The Peace Center is offering a 24-hour Basic Mediation and Negotiation Training for those interested in becoming volunteer or professional mediators. The training will be held on **September 26, 27 and 28 from 9:00 AM – 5:00 PM at The Peace Center**, 102 West Maple Avenue in Langhorne, PA. Participants will learn the mediation process, caucusing, writing agreements, and communication skills such as active listening, reframing, summarizing, and working with difficult people. Participants will receive a Certificate of Completion. CLE credits are available. The training will be led by Bill Jacobsen, Ph.D., who teaches in the International Peace and Conflict Resolution Masters program at Arcadia University. He mediates in Custody Court and Dependency Court in Philadelphia, and regularly offers training in Basic Mediation in the community. The fee for this Basic Mediation and Negotiation Training is \$435 if participants register before September 19. The fee for participants who register after September 19 is \$475.
